- Leaving a gift to Carmel School is easy to do - you can add a clause to your Will pertaining to your intended gift or add a codicil to an existing Will
- We always recommend you seek advice from a Solicitor when drafting your Will. The wording is very important and your solicitor can advise you on the different types of gifts.
- It is an important step to talk to family and loved ones about your Will. Communication will ensure your final wishes are carried out.
- Give us the opportunity to say thank you. By telling us you have included a gift in your will we recognise you as investing in the future of Jewish education in Perth.

Updating a will

If you already have a Will, the most cost effective way to include a bequest to Carmel School is by adding a codicil - a short legal amendment to your Will. Check with your Solicitor if a codicil is appropriate for the updates you wish to make.

Wording for your will

Most of our supporters have chosen to include a gift for general purposes, if you wish to specify a specific purpose we would ask that you get in contact for a confidential discussion that will allow us to honour your wishes effectively.

Wording for your will
