



CARMEL SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. The Academic Scholarship is awarded based on the written application, supporting documentation, results of the independent academic test and an interview, at the discretion of the Scholarships Committee.
2. The Carmel Academy of Performing Arts (CAPA) Scholarship is awarded based on the written application, supporting documentation and an interview with a demonstration of a chosen talent, at the discretion of the Scholarships Committee.
3. The Principal's Scholarship is awarded based on the written application, supporting documentation and an interview, at the discretion of the Principal.
4. Students may apply for more than one scholarship. A reference to a "Scholarship" in this document refers to a Carmel School Academic Scholarship, the CAPA Scholarship, or the Principal's Scholarship (as the context requires).
5. Applications are welcome from both Jewish and non-Jewish families.
6. To be eligible for a Carmel School Scholarship, candidates must have Australian citizenship or permanent residency in Australia.
7. Only applications that are complete, accompanied by all required supporting documents and submitted by the published deadline will be considered.
8. Scholarships are limited in number and subject to availability and the discretion of the Scholarships Committee for Academic and CAPA Scholarships, and the discretions of the Principal for the Principal's Scholarship.
9. Carmel School reserves the right to not offer any scholarship, or to otherwise vary the number of scholarships offered, at the end of the application and review period.
10. Awarding a Scholarship does not preclude a family from consideration for the Fee Assistance Program (which is separately assessed and subject to different terms and conditions). The Principal will determine if there are grounds for the co-existence of a scholarship and fee assistance for a student.
11. Academic and CAPA Scholarships are open to all students entering Year 7 in 2027 or 2028, whether they are currently attending Carmel School or not.
12. The Principal's Scholarship is open to all students entering Year 5-12 in 2027, whether they are currently attending Carmel School or not.
13. There are separate scholarships available to be awarded to current students and prospective students respectively. These Scholarships will be separately assessed by the Scholarships Committee.
14. With regard to the Academic Scholarship and CAPA Scholarship, each scholarship will cover up to 50% of the tuition fees for Years 7–12, with the final amount to be decided by the Scholarships Committee.
15. With regard to the Principal's Scholarship, each scholarship will cover up to 50% of the tuition fees for students in Years 5–12, with the final amount and duration of the scholarship to be decided by the Principal and reviewed annually.
16. The award of any scholarship will be subject to these terms and conditions, and the terms and conditions of any letter of offer issued by Carmel School.
17. Carmel School reserves the right, at its absolute discretion, to rescind a scholarship at any time, including where the recipient has failed to comply with the School's policies

- or values or has not met the expectations of the scholarship, as determined by the School Board and the Principal.
18. Scholarships are not transferable and the recipient must pay the balance of tuition fees on time via the usual payment options. Non-payment of outstanding fees may forfeit any scholarship awarded.
 19. A scholarship cannot be deferred.
 20. The Scholarship Program, including the number and type of scholarships available each year, may vary at the discretion of the Principal and the School's Board.
 21. Academic Scholarship applications incur a non-refundable \$140 application fee to cover the costs of testing.
 22. All applicants will be notified in writing of the outcome of their application. Students sitting the Academic Scholarship test will not receive an individual performance report.
 23. Carmel School is not obliged to provide feedback about the outcome of an unsuccessful scholarship application.
 24. All applications are reviewed and considered by the Scholarship Committee and all decisions are final.
 25. Scholarship recipients agree to become ambassadors of Carmel School, assisting with reasonable marketing and communications activities. This may include attending recruitment events, answering enquiries from prospective students, contributing to short articles and use of the scholarship recipient's images for newsletters, online and social material and blogs.
 26. Successful applicants will have five business days in which to accept or decline a scholarship offer (unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Principal). Acceptance will be confirmed by the return of the signed letter of offer and accompanying enrolment documentation. If a written response is not received within the date specified on the letter of offer, the offer will be deemed to have been declined.

SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTIONS AND EXPECTATIONS

Academic Scholarship

The Academic Scholarship is awarded to students who demonstrate exceptional academic ability, intellectual curiosity and a genuine commitment to learning. Recipients are expected to embody the School's values of excellence, integrity, connectedness, curiosity and courage, and to show the capacity to contribute positively to both the School and the wider community.

The scholarship provides partial remission of tuition fees of up to 50% per annum for a period of up to six years, at the discretion of the Scholarships Committee.

The recipient is expected to demonstrate an ongoing commitment to; their studies with high levels of effort and academic performance, the betterment of the school environment, the service of others and the positive representation of Carmel School in the community as an excellent ambassador for the School. Demonstrating the highest personal and professional standards, the recipient must be a Mensch (a person of high integrity, honour, and rectitude) and actively participate in School life. The scholarship may be withdrawn at any time if the above expectations are not being met.

Carmel Academy of Performing Arts (CAPA) Scholarship

The Carmel Academy of Performing Arts (CAPA) Scholarship is awarded to students who demonstrate exceptional talent in acting, singing, dancing and/or playing a musical instrument. Applicants should also display intellectual curiosity and a genuine commitment to learning. Recipients are expected to embody the School's values of excellence, integrity, connectedness, curiosity and courage, and to show the capacity to contribute positively to both the School and the wider community.

The scholarship provides partial remission of tuition fees of up to 50% per annum for a period of up to six years, at the discretion of the Scholarships Committee.

The recipient is expected to demonstrate an ongoing commitment to; their studies, the betterment of the school environment, the service of others and the positive representation of Carmel School in the community as an excellent ambassador for the School. Demonstrating the highest personal and professional standards, the recipient must be a Mensch (a person of high integrity, honour, and rectitude) and actively participate in the CAPA program and School life. The scholarship may be withdrawn at any time if the above expectations are not being met.

Principal's Scholarship

The Principal's Scholarship may be awarded at the discretion of the Principal to one or more students each Year. The recipient may or may not be a current student of the School. Applicants must be of good character and demonstrate the capacity to make a meaningful contribution to Carmel School and the wider community. The scholarship recognises a student who embodies the School's values of excellence, integrity, connectedness, curiosity and courage. Importantly the recipient must be able to positively influence others.

Applicants should focus on a range of factors, including but not limited to, positive academic achievement, co-curricular involvement, personal qualities and community engagement.

The scholarship provides a partial remission of tuition fees of up to 50% per year and is reviewed annually. The duration of the scholarship will be determined by the Principal.

The recipient is expected to demonstrate an ongoing commitment to; their studies, the betterment of the school environment, the service of others and the positive representation of Carmel School in the community as an excellent ambassador for the School. Complying with Carmel School's policies and values, the recipient must demonstrate the highest personal and professional standards, be a Mensch (a person of high integrity, honour, and rectitude) and actively participate in School life. The scholarship may be withdrawn at any time if the above expectations are not being met.
